How do we obtain your personal data?

Sometimes you provide us with your personal data, sometimes your personal data is collected automatically.

- We gather personal data about you when you provide it to us or interact with us directly.
 - [e.g. as part of our business acceptance processes, in the course of and in connection with the services we provide to you, when you register for a training, workshop or event]
- A number of facilities on our website such as the contact form and call-to-actions invite you to provide us with your personal data. The purpose of these facilities is apparent at the point that you provide your personal data. We only use your data for those purposes.
- We collect your personal data while monitoring our technology tools such as our marketing automation tools, also including our website and email communications sent to and from us.



Which are the legal grounds for using your personal data?

Data protection legislation requires that we need to have a legal ground for collecting and processing your personal data. We collect and process your personal data on the following legal grounds:

We use cookies

We use cookies. Cookies are small text files that are placed on your device. You can enable or disable cookies at any time by amending the cookie settings of your browser.

We use cookies on our website to enable us to keep track of your choices and preferences (e.g. language choice) and to enhance the use of our website.

We also use third party cookies such as Google Analytics. We rely on Google Analytics cookies to enhance the functionality and user-friendliness of our website, and to improve our services. Google Analytics provides us with aggregated statistical data about your use of this website including details such as page views, source and time spent on our website. This information is depersonalised and is displayed as numbers. This means that it cannot be tracked back to individuals.

Besides this, it is also possible for cookies to be placed by social media (e.g. LinkedIn, Facebook, Twitter) referred to on our website. Social media use such cookies to enable functionalities as well as to collect data which they can use for their own purposes. Please note that where third parties use cookies we have no control over how those third parties use those cookies.

List of necessary cookies

List of functional cookies

Functional cookies are used to recognise users when they return to our website. They enable the personalisation of content and the recognition of users, and they remember user preferences (e.g. choice of language). It is not possible to refuse these cookies if you want to surf on our website.

showCookieNotice	1 year	0 or 1	Is set to 1 if the user clicks on "Agree" at the bottom of the website. From then on the cookie bar is no longer displayed on the following page requests.
laravel_session	1 hour	A token	Contains a unique token that is kept between requests, to be able to pass on information to the user uniquely from page to page. This is standard logic, which is currently not used to transmit functional data.

List of analytical cookies
